

Duties of the NB NSC FSC Ice Monitor

Arriving at Rink: Please arrive at the rink at least 10 minutes before the session is scheduled to begin.

Monitor Materials: At the beginning of your shift, hang the laminated signs (located in the club locker in rink #3) on the door to the ice & door to the rink and put the signs away at shift end.

Recording Information: Check off skaters, both contract and buy-on, as they go on the ice. Skaters buying-on should be added to the list of skaters for the session by printing their names legibly. Skaters not there after 10 minutes should be marked "NS" for no show.

If space is limited on a session, home club skaters have first priority to purchase available ice followed by Associate Members. Non-members have last priority and must meet the requirements of a Non Club Member/Guest as stated below. If necessary, contracted skaters who have been marked as "NS" may lose their ice time to a buy-on skater if space is not adequate to accommodate all buy-on requests.

Non Club Member/Guests: Non-club members can guest skate on NB NSC FSC ice provided they are a prospective club member. A prospective member may be admitted to three (3) club sessions during the year (July 1st – June 30th) upon payment of random ice charges when accompanied by a Club member or introduced by an active Professional, who in turn introduces him or her to the Chairman of the Membership Committee, or in absence of the Chairman to one or the Committee members, or a member of the Board. The skater must pay the required fee to NSC before they are permitted to skate.

If the skater exceeds three sessions the individual will be required to join NB NSC FSC as a full or associate member. Exceptions may be authorized in advance by the NB NSC FSC Board of Directors on an individual basis. **These Names should be recorded in the Ice Monitor Binder**

Visiting Pro Requirements: Non-club professionals may teach on NB NSC FSC ice provided they are a prospective club member. A prospective member may be admitted to three (3) club sessions during the year (July 1st – June 30th) when accompanied by a club member or introduced by an active Professional, who in turn introduces him or her to the Chairman of the Membership Committee, or in absence of the Chairman to one or the Committee members, or a member of the Board. **Professionals need to provide proof of liability insurance, proof of membership in PSA and USFS, have attained USFS green light status, and sign and agree to abide by the club's document: Expectations of NB NSC FSC Professional Staff prior to coaching on NB NSC FSC ice. Names should be recorded in the Ice Monitor Binder and copies of the paperwork kept there as well.**

If the Professional exceeds three sessions the individual will be required to join NB NSC FSC as a full or associate member. Exceptions may be authorized in advance by the NB NSC FSC Board of Directors on an individual basis.

Responding to Problems: If the Monitor encounters any problems during his or her session they should contact the Skaters coach (if known), and a NB NSC FSC Executive Board Member as soon as possible. Please report any problems to the Professional Liaison as well.
